Placer County Gears up for June 4 Special Election

In preparation for the June 4 special general election, the Placer County Elections Office distributed voter information guides to registered Placer County voters in California's 1st Senate District.

Senate District 1 is one of 40 California State Senate districts and includes the majority of Placer County. The seat is currently vacant due to the resignation of Ted Gaines, who was sworn in as an elected member of the California State Board of Equalization earlier this year.

The voter information guide provides State Senate District 1 race information and polling place locations. The majority of polling place locations have changed due to the special election.
