POSITION TITLE: Director of Academic Improvement and Multi-Tiered Systems of Support

(MTSS)

SUMMARY:

The Director of Academic Improvement and Multi-Tiered Systems of Support is responsible for providing leadership and coordination of the district's academic support programs and multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS) to meet students' academic, social, emotional, and behavioral needs. The Director will provide leadership to the district's math improvement efforts through the use of improvement science process in collaboration with schools. This includes the planning, implementation, evaluation, and reporting of this work to district stakeholders. The Director will provide supervision and support to math instructional coaches and program specialists who support curriculum, instruction, and professional learning.

SUPERVISOR:

This position reports directly to the Associate Superintendent of Elementary Education and Educational Services and the Associate Superintendent of Secondary Education and Educational Services.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The essential duties and responsibilities for this position include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Develop, implement, oversee academic improvement efforts in all content areas with a focus on math.
- 2. Lead Improvement Science efforts district-wide to improve academic outcomes for students.
- 3. Provide support, coaching, and supervision of Math Instructional Coaches.
- 4. Oversees professional development to support academic improvement and MTSS.
- 5. Direct K-12 curriculum adoption process and implementation.
- 6. Develop, maintain, and support academic interventions/accelerations in K-12 schools.
- 7. Enhance, maintain, and support PBIS and additional tiered behavior support systems in K-12 schools.
- 8. Develop, implement, and provide ongoing support for tiered socio-emotional support systems in K-12 schools.
- 9. Provides leadership and facilitation in the development and implementation of common grade level and course assessments for math and ELA in K-12 schools.
- 10. Manage collection of data sets in K-12 and facilitate the use of data to make instructional decisions that benefit students at the site and classroom level.
- 11. Assist principals in implementation of MTSS structures including Professional Learning Communities (PLCs).
- 12. Assist in providing leadership to District efforts to achieve equity and inclusion goals to eliminate gaps in achievement and wellness.
